Hello!

Welcome to Camp Mechuwana, summer 2026, as we celebrate our 78th year on the shores of Lower Narrows Pond in Winthrop. We are excited about our upcoming summer and fall programs: we have added a middle school rally camp, another grandparent/grandchild event, and an additional crafters program.

Camp Prices

I want to take a minute to address the increase in camp prices that you will see in this brochure. We have worked tirelessly to keep camp costs as low as possible. Thanks to hundreds of individuals and organizations who support us financially, we have been able to do just that. But, as they have everywhere, the expenses to run camp have increased, especially in the areas of insurance, utilities, and food. Due to those costs, we have made the difficult decision to raise the prices more than we would like to. Please know that we will continue to honor our commitment to never turn a child away because of their family's financial situation. That has been our policy since we were founded in 1948 and will be Mechuwana's policy forever.

Early Registration Encouraged

Every summer, camps fill quickly so we encourage you to register your child or children for camp early. To encourage early registration, we are allowing families to register their children without first paying the deposit. Our one request is that you make a solid commitment so that you do not take a space away from another family.

Scholarships & Volunteer Credits

Mechuwana continues its long history of ensuring that no camper is turned away for financial reasons. We will work to ensure that anyone who wants to attend a week of camp can. To request financial assistance, please contact the camp office by phone or email. We also offer a **volunteer credit of \$150** for each adult who volunteers as a camp counselor or dean during the 2026 season. That credit can be applied to one camp registration for a child in your family. Volunteers must meet certain criteria to fill this role. Please contact the office for more information about how to receive this credit.

How to Register

1. Choose a camp or retreat experience. Select your choice(s) of week(s) to attend. Write your choice(s) in the area of the registration form showing three event lines. **Beneath these lines, please put in your choice(s) for alternate camps in case your first choice(s) is/are full. Please make a copy of the registration form for yourself.**
2. **Send in a \$50 nonrefundable registration fee** for each camp chosen with your registration (not applicable for spring youth weekend). The remainder of the cost is due three weeks prior to your camp week unless you have made other arrangements with the camp registrar.
3. Talk with your church/agency to see if they have camp scholarships available. If they do, please supply that information to us on the registration form. **If payments are being made on your behalf, please be sure they include your name and the name of the camp program you are attending on any check or paperwork.**
4. Camp fees, **except registration fees**, are refundable for nonparticipants who **notify the camp registrar at least three weeks before the camp begins.**
5. Confirmation packets will be mailed to campers in early April (first round). **Please open immediately.** **The health history form needs to be filled out, signed, and sent back to camp as soon as possible. All medical paperwork must be received in advance of your week at camp.** (Health forms can also be found at mechuwana.org)

Arrival and Check-in for Camps

Arrival and check-in for all camps is on Sunday from 1 PM to 3 PM. Pick-up for most camps is on Thursday. Mom/Child, First Timers, & Grandcamp leave on Wednesday morning. Music theatre camps have pick-up times after their final performances. You will get more specific information about camp pick-up times in your Dear Camper packet of information once you are registered.

Upon arrival for your camp, please head to registration check-in inside the Dining Commons.

Mechuwana Camperships
